PREP NOW TO GROW LATER

Prepping the Basics

If your flower beds are looking a little overgrown and need tending to - now is the time. The cooler weather is an ideal time to start thinking about over seeding your lawn, to fix patches. Why? Because the cooler temperatures mean less evaporation of the soil moisture.

Rake it Up

Be sure to rake your yard to pull up any dead grasses and remove any fallen leaves. Your lawn can breathe better without the extra layer, though some fallen leaf coverage can be helpful to protect plant beds from an early frost.

Don't Forget The Eavestroughs

Be sure to clean your eves troughs before fall as they will only get more clogged up as more leaves start to fall.
